

INSTALLATION INSTRUCTIONS

Convertible Club Car Full Enclosures

GENERAL INFORMATION

Your top and enclosure have been designed and manufactured of the highest quality materials available.

As is the case with all fabric products, care should be taken to keep sharp objects, hot items or solvents from coming in contact with the material or any of the components of the enclosure.

Never fold up any of the enclosure parts while they are wet as this may promote mildew growth, which may erode your fabric enclosure. Allow your enclosure to dry prior to storage.

When working with enclosures, try to prevent any clear window glass from resting on other clear window glass. Under extreme heat and moisture a temporary bonding of one piece to the other may occur. Separation of the two pieces may be difficult and damage may occur.

STORAGE & CARE INSTRUCTIONS

For storage it is recommended that the curtains be hung with the provided eyelets in lieu of folding. Folding curtains could place creases in vinyl windows causing premature damage.



WARNING:

If using electrical tools during installation, do not install fasteners while club car is near water.

INSTALLATION INSTRUCTIONS

STEP 1

Start with the Aft curtain and temporarily tape each curtain to the frame for a smooth fit. This is important to make sure all curtains connect together.

STEP 2

Zip the side curtains to the aft curtain to make sure of location and proper fit around the frame.

STEP 3

Install snap studs into the frame at the corners and curves of the frame first to ensure the proper fit. (Male Stud Snaps included in the package with curtains)

STEP 4

Install snap studs as needed in the center of the frames at the locations of the female snaps in the curtains. Pre-drilling may be necessary while installing the screw studs.

STEP 5

For best results center the aft curtain and install the corner snaps first. Connect the snaps as you install each curtain to keep a snug fit.
